Water Courts and the Water Court Process

Biography:

Dan Brown has practiced with the law firm of Fischer, Brown, Bartlett, & Gunn in Fort Collins since 1999. While his work includes water quality and real property matters, the focus of his practice is representing a variety of clients before the Division No. 1 Water Court (South Platte Basin). Brown received his Juris Doctorate (JD), with an emphasis in Environmental and Natural Resources Law, from the University of Oregon School of Law in 1997. He also received his Masters of Science in Applied Economics (with an emphasis in Agricultural and Natural Resources) from Montana State University in 1994, and a Bachelor of Science in Economics from the University of Colorado in 1990. Prior to joining the firm, Brown clerked for two years for the Honorable Walter Stauffacher in the District Court of Washington State. In this capacity, he served as the lead clerk on the original adjudication of water rights on the Yakima River Basin in Washington State (the equivalent of the Water Referee in the Colorado court system).
