Water Transactions in Colorado

Amy Beatie, Colorado Water Trust

Biography:

Amy Beatie began her tenure at the Colorado Water Trust in 2007, after nearly six years practicing water litigation at two different Front Range water law firms. Prior to practicing water litigation, she clerked for the Honorable Gregory J. Hobbs of the Colorado Supreme Court. Beatie obtained her undergraduate degree from Dartmouth College and her law degree from the University of Denver Sturm College of Law. While in law school, she helped create the University of Denver Water Law Review, and eventually served as its Editor-in-Chief. She now sits on its Advisory Board, as well as the Advisory Board of Metro State University's One World One Water Center and the Board of Directors of the Colorado Water Congress. In May of 2013, she received the Colorado Foundation for Water Education's Emerging Leader award. She has lived in Colorado since 1993, although two short detours took her for a year and half to Alaska and Wyoming.



Abstract:

The reallocation of water rights through voluntary transfers has become a significant, important part of the water law of Colorado and other Western states. It is being used both to reallocate human use of water and to restore flows to depleted rivers, among other outcomes. "Water transactions" has developed as a distinct body of law. In this seminar, Beatie will provide the basic tools and concepts necessary to understand water transactions under Colorado water law.
